

# Early Warning and Reporting System (EWARS)- Weekly Bulletin: Nepal


## 2<sup>nd</sup> Epidemiological Week, 2022

### 23<sup>rd</sup> January, 2022

#### Highlights

- 910394 Cases of Coronavirus disease (COVID-19) have been confirmed in Nepal, of which 821699 cases have been recovered so far.
- Of the reported cases, Sever Acute Respiratory Infection (SARI) is the leading cause of morbidity in week 02.


#### Number of cases reported for each disease this week



**Note:** This bulletin includes data since January 2021 till date, including comparison of the same period last year. Since, May 2019, 36 new sentinel sites (including public hospitals, private hospitals, and medical colleges) were added and were gradually oriented and started reporting, thus increasing the number of reporting sites. The current number of sentinel sites is 118.


### 1. Acute Gastro-Enteritis (AGE)

- 76 cases of AGE were reported this week. The majority of these cases were reported from Lalitpur (7 cases), Rupandehi, Bajhang, Ilam and Kathmandu (5 cases from each districts), Jhapa and Sunsari (4 cases from each districts).
- 134 Cases of AGE were reported this week in 2021.



## 2. Severe Acute Respiratory Infection (SARI)

- 166 Cases of SARI were reported this week. The majority of these cases were reported from Rupandehi (21 cases), Jhapa (20 cases), Surkhet (11 cases), Morang (10 cases), Dang (9 cases), Palpa (8 cases), Kailali, Kathmandu, Bajhang (6 cases from each cases).
- 113 Cases of SARI were reported this week in 2021.



## 3. Malaria

- Zero case of malaria was reported this week.

## 4. Dengue

- Two cases of dengue were reported this week; one each cases were reported from Kanchanpur and Jhapa districts.
- Two cases of dengue were reported this week in 2021.

## 5. Kala-azar

- Four cases of kala-azar were reported this week; one each cases were reported from Kanchanpur, Palpa, Sankhuwasabha and Mahottari districts.
- Nine case of kala-azar were reported this week in 2021.

## 6. Cholera

- Zero cases of Cholera were reported this week.

## Other diseases


### Scrub typhus

- Six Cases of scrub typhus were reported this week. The majority of the cases were reported from Rupandehi (2 cases) and one each cases were reported from Darchula, Bajhang, Palpa and Rauthat districts.
- Five cases of scrub typhus were reported this week in 2021.
