Early Warning and Reporting System (EWARS) Weekly Bulletin

(34th Epidemiological Week) 4 September 2017



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Section 1: The Early Warning and Reporting System (EWARS) Highlights

- Influenza A/ H1N1 Pdm09: 846 cases of Influenza A H1N1 Pdm09 including 12 deaths have been confirmed since 1 January, 2017.
- Kala-azar: Five cases of Kala-azar are reported this week, two from Sukraraj Tropical and Infectious disease hospital, Teku and one each from BPKIHS, Dharan, Kanti Children Hospital, Kathmandu and District Hospital, Pyuthan. The cases are from Sindhuli, Arghakhanchi, Mugu, Sunsari and Pyuthan district respectively.
- **Malaria:** Two cases of Malaria are reported this week. One case of (*Plasmodium Falciparum*) is reported from Lumbini Zonal Hospital, Rupandehi and another case of (*Plasmodium Vivax*) is reported from District Hospital, Pyuthan. The cases are from Rupandehi and Pyuthan district respectively.
- Scrub Typhus: 14 cases of Scrub Typhus are reported this week, 8 from United Mission Hospital, Palpa 3 from Bheri Zonal Hospital, Banke, 2 from Sukraraj Tropical and Infectious Disease Hospital, Teku and one from District Hospital, Dhankuta.
- **SARI:** One death from SARI is reported this week from United Mission Hospital, Palpa and the deceased was from Waling Municipality of Syangja district.


The EWARS was established in 1997 to strengthen the flow of information on vector-borne and other outbreak prone infectious diseases from the district to Epidemiology and Disease Control Division (EDCD) and Vector-Borne Disease Research and Training Center (VBDRTC), Hetauda. Rapid Response Teams (RRTs) can be mobilized at short notice to facilitate prompt outbreak response at Central, Regional and District level. RRTs can also support local level health institutions for investigation and outbreak control activities.

This information system is hospital-based and is currently operational in 64 hospitals (out of 82 sites) throughout Nepal (Figure 1). So far, the EWARS mainly focuses on the **weekly reporting** of number of cases and deaths (including "zero" reports) of six priority diseases/syndromes—Malaria, Kala-azar, Dengue, Acute Gastroenteritis (AGE), Cholera and Severe Acute Respiratory Infection (SARI), and other epidemic potential diseases/syndromes (like enteric fever). It equally focuses on **immediate reporting** (to be reported within 24 hours of diagnosis) of one confirmed case of Cholera, Kala-azar severe and complicated Malaria and one suspect/clinical case of Dengue as well as 5 or more cases of AGE and SARI from the same geographical locality in one week period.



Reporting Status


Out of 64 functional EWARS sentinel sites, report was received from 45 sentinel sites (70 percent) whereas 19 sentinel sites did not report in 34th Epidemiological week of 2017. The reporting coverage is increased as compared to the previous week.



1.1 Acute Gastro-Enteritis and Cholera

200 cases of AGE are reported in 34th epidemiological week of 2017. Among 200 cases, the majority of cases are from Dolakha (20 cases), Kapilbastu (15 cases), Bara (14 cases), Kathmandu (12 cases), Jhapa (11 cases), Kanchanpur (9 cases), Rupandehi (7 cases), Sunsari (7 cases), Doti (7 cases), Lamjung (6 cases) and Pyuthan (6 cases) district. The number of AGE cases reported in 34th week this year did not exceed the number of AGE cases reported in the same week last year (209 cases).


No death from AGE is reported this week. Fifteen deaths from AGE are reported so far this year. Thirteen deaths from AGE were reported in 2016.



1.2 Severe Acute Respiratory Infection (SARI)

307 cases of SARI are reported in 34th epidemiological week of 2017. The cases of SARI reported this week exceed the number reported in the same week last year (270 cases). Among 307 cases, the majority of cases are from Jhapa (51 cases), Lalitpur (29 cases), Kailali (19 cases), Syangja (16 cases), Kanchanpur (15 cases), Morang (13 cases), Panchthar (13 cases), Rupandehi (11 cases), Palpa (11 cases) and Baglung (11 cases) district.

One death from SARI is reported this week from United Mission Hospital, Palpa and the deceased was from Waling Municipality of Syangja district. Forty nine deaths from SARI are reported so far this year. Seventy deaths from SARI were reported in 2016.



1.3 Enteric Fever

134 cases of Enteric fever are reported this week, including 12 from Lamjung, 11 from Bardiya, 10 from Kaski, 10 from Tanahun, 9 from Nawalparasi, 7 from Sindhuli, 6 from Morang, 6 from Syangja and 6 from Gulmi district. One death from Enteric Fever is reported so far this year.

1.4 Malaria

Two cases of Malaria are reported this week. One case of (*Plasmodium Falciparum*) is reported from Lumbini Zonal Hospital, Rupandehi and another case of (*Plasmodium Vivax*) is reported from District Hospital, Pyuthan. The cases are from Rupandehi and Pyuthan district respectively.

Fifty-three cases of Malaria are reported so far this year. Eighty three cases of Malaria were reported through EWARS in 2016.

1.5 Dengue

No case of Dengue is reported this week. Fourteen cases of Dengue are reported so far this year.

1.6 Kala-azar

Five cases of Kala-azar are reported this week, two from Sukraraj Tropical and Infectious disease hospital, Teku and one each from BPKIHS, Dharan, Kanti Children Hospital, Kathmandu and District Hospital, Pyuthan. The cases are from Sindhuli, Arghakhanchi, Mugu, Sunsari and Pyuthan district respectively.

One hundred fifty three cases of Kala-azar cases are reported so far this year. 150 cases of Kala-azar were reported through EWARS in 2016.

1.7 Scrub Typhus

14 cases of Scrub Typhus are reported this week, 8 from United Mission Hospital, Palpa 3 from Bheri Zonal Hospital, Banke, 2 from Sukraraj Tropical and Infectious Disease Hospital, Teku and one from District Hospital, Dhankuta. Among 14 cases, 5 are from Gulmi, 3 from Palpa, 3 from Banke, 1 from Dhading, 1 from Dhankuta and one from Sarlahi.
