Early Warning and Reporting System (EWARS) Weekly Bulletin (45th Epidemiological Week)

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Section 1: The Early Warning and Reporting System (EWARS) Highlights

- **Dengue:** A total of 1942 Dengue cases have been reported from 28 different districts since January 2017, out of which 545 cases from Rupandehi, 543 from Jhapa, 438 from Mahottari and 130 from Sarlahi district.
- Kala-azar: Four cases of Kala azar are reported this week one each from United Mission Hospital, Palpa, BPKIHS, Dharan, Sukraraj Tropical and Infectious disease Hospital, Teku and Lumbini Zonal Hospital, Rupandehi. The cases are from Palpa, Saptari, Rolpa and Pyuthan district.
- Malaria: One case of Malaria (*Plasmodium Falciparum*) is reported this week from Koshi Zonal Hospital, Morang and the case is from Morang district.
- Scrub Typhus: 14 cases of Scrub Typhus are reported this week, 7 from United Mission Hospital, Palpa, 3 from Kanti Children Hospital, Kathmandu, 2 from Sukraraj Tropical and Infectious Disease Hospital, Kathmandu and 2 from District Hospital, Pyuthan.
- AGE: Two deaths from AGE are reported this week, one each from Koshi Zonal Hospital, Morang and Patan Hospital, Lalitpur. The deceased were from Morang and Lalitpur district.
- **SARI:** Three deaths from SARI are reported this week, one from United mission Hospital, Palpa and two from Patan Hospital, Lalitpur. The deceased were from Gulmi, Kaski and Lalitpur district.


The EWARS was established in 1997 to strengthen the flow of information on vector-borne and other outbreak prone infectious diseases from the district to Epidemiology and Disease Control Division (EDCD) and Vector-Borne Disease Research and Training Center (VBDRTC), Hetauda. Rapid Response Teams (RRTs) can be mobilized at short notice to facilitate prompt outbreak response at Central, Regional and District level. RRTs can also support local level health institutions for investigation and outbreak control activities.

This information system is hospital-based and is currently operational in 64 hospitals (out of 82 sites) throughout Nepal (Figure 1). So far, the EWARS mainly focuses on the **weekly reporting** of number of cases and deaths (including "zero" reports) of six priority diseases/syndromes—Malaria, Kala-azar, Dengue, Acute Gastroenteritis (AGE), Cholera and Severe Acute Respiratory Infection (SARI), and other epidemic potential diseases/syndromes (like enteric fever). It equally focuses on **immediate reporting** (to be reported within 24 hours of diagnosis) of one confirmed case of Cholera, Kala-azar severe and complicated Malaria and one suspect/clinical case of Dengue as well as 5 or more cases of AGE and SARI from the same geographical locality in one week period.



Reporting Status


Out of 64 functional EWARS sentinel sites, report was received from 45 sentinel sites (70 percent) whereas 19 sentinel sites did not report in 45th Epidemiological week of 2017. The reporting coverage is slightly decreased as compared to the previous week.



1.1 Acute Gastro-Enteritis and Cholera

137 cases of AGE are reported in 45th epidemiological week of 2017. Among 137 cases, the majority of cases are from Dhanusha (14 cases), Dolakha (10 cases), Pyuthan (8 cases), Rupandehi (7 cases), Morang (6 cases), Illam (6 cases), Jhapa (6 cases), Kanchanpur (6 cases), Bara (6 cases) and Panchthar (5 cases) district. The number of AGE cases reported in 45th week this year is same as the number of AGE cases reported in the same week last year (136 cases).


Two deaths from AGE are reported this week, one each from Koshi Zonal Hospital, Morang and Patan Hospital, Lalitpur. The deceased were from Morang and Lalitpur district. Nineteen deaths from AGE are reported so far this year. Thirteen deaths from AGE were reported in 2016.



1.2 Severe Acute Respiratory Infection (SARI)

297 cases of SARI are reported in 45th epidemiological week of 2017. The cases of SARI reported this week exceed the number reported in the same week last year (222 cases). Among 297 cases, the majority of cases are from Jhapa (35 cases), Morang (28 cases), Syangja (22 cases), Gulmi (15 cases), Lalitpur (15 cases), Dhankuta (13 cases), Palpa (12 cases), Panchthar (12 cases), Kanchanpur (11 cases), Kapilbastu (11 cases) and Sunsari (10 cases) district.

Three deaths from SARI are reported this week, one from United mission Hospital, Palpa and two from Patan Hospital, Lalitpur. The deceased were from Gulmi, Kaski and Lalitpur district. Seventy five deaths from SARI are reported so far this year. Seventy deaths from SARI were reported in 2016.



1.3 Enteric Fever

50 cases of Enteric fever are reported this week, including 11 from Kaski, 6 from Morang, 3 from Sindhuli, 3 from Bardiya and 3 from Dhading district. Three deaths from Enteric Fever are reported so far this year.

1.4 Malaria

One case of Malaria (*Plasmodium Falciparum*) is reported this week from Koshi Zonal Hospital, Morang and the case is from Morang district.

Eighty eight cases of Malaria are reported so far this year. Eighty three cases of Malaria were reported through EWARS in 2016.

1.5 Dengue

A total of 1942 Dengue cases have been reported from 28 different districts since January 2017, out of which 545 cases from Rupandehi, 543 from Jhapa, 438 from Mahottari, 130 from Sarlahi, 67 from Dhading, , 46 from Kapilbastu, 27 from Dhanusha, , 29 from Nawalparasi, 23 from Chitwan, 15 from Arghakhanchi , 13 from Gulmi, 12 from Rautahat, , 11 from Dang, , 11 from Palpa, 10 from Pyuthan, 4 from Rolpa , 3 from Makawanpur, 3 from Baglung, 2 from Bara, 2 from Surkhet and one each from Syangja, Dailekh, Banke, Bhaktapur, Kathmandu, Achham, Gorkha and Kaski.

1.6 Kala-azar

Four cases of Kala azar are reported this week one each from United Mission Hospital, Palpa, BPKIHS, Dharan, Sukraraj Tropical and Infectious disease Hospital, Teku and Lumbini Zonal Hospital, Rupandehi. The cases are from Palpa, Saptari, Rolpa and Pyuthan district.

One hundred ninety six cases of Kala-azar cases are reported so far this year. 150 cases of Kala-azar were reported through EWARS in 2016.

1.7 Scrub Typhus

14 cases of Scrub Typhus are reported this week, 7 from United Mission Hospital, Palpa, 3 from Kanti Children Hospital, Kathmandu, 2 from Sukraraj Tropical and Infectious Disease Hospital, Kathmandu and 2 from District Hospital, Pyuthan. The cases are from Palpa, Arghakhanchi, Gulmi, Makawanpur, Okhaldhunga, Sarlahi, Sindhuli, Dhading and Pyuthan district.

431 cases of Scrub Typhus are reported so far this year.
